## New Pedestrian Signal on Tiburon Boulevard

Recently, CalTrans installed a new pedestrian signal on Tiburon Boulevard at Stewart Drive. The High Intensity Activated Crosswalk (HAWK), is a traffic control device designed to help pedestrians safely cross busy or higher-speed roadways at midblock crossings and uncontrolled intersections.

The beacon head consists of two red lenses above a single yellow lens. The lenses remain "dark" until a pedestrian desiring to cross the street pushes the call button to activate the beacon. The signal then initiates a yellow to red lighting sequence consisting of steady and flashing lights that directs motorists to slow and come to a stop. The pedestrian signal then flashes a WALK display to the pedestrian. Once the pedestrian has safely crossed, the hybrid beacon again goes dark. Please refer to the graphic for detailed information.

## Happy Flag Day!

Got a tattered American flag that needs replacing? The Marin County United Veterans Council will accept your torn and faded Old Glory on Flag Day - Wednesday, June 14 - or during the Marin County Fair, which runs June 30 through July 4. Both dropoff locations will be at the Marin County Fairgrounds in San Rafael.

The Flag Day dropoff site will be at the military memorials next to Civic Center Drive at 10 Avenue of the Flags between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. The County Fair dropoff will be at the veterans council's booth inside the fairgrounds.

According to traditional military etiquette, American flags made of cotton must be burned and the ashes

buried. Flags made of synthetic material should be recycled to prevent creation of hazardous gases. The Veterans Council is accepting all American flags during the two dropoffs.

## **Portuguese Dairy Mural Wall Ribbon Cutting**

Last Friday, we celebrated the grand opening of the Portuguese Dairy Mural Wall on the Old Rail Trail.

Ready for a little history? Before Tiburon was a railroad town, it was a dairy town. Tiburon's dairies were operated by Portuguese Azorean immigrant families, who were an important part of the early Tiburon community. Tiburon's three historical dairies are now the locations of our three public schools: the Hilarita Dairy is now Reed School, the Big Reed Dairy is now Bel Aire School, and the Little Reed Dairy is now Del Mar School.

The mural wall is open for viewing now. You can find it on the Old Rail Trail immediately past McKegney Green, near the South of Knoll Park and restrooms.
