





Stewart Drive Crosswalk Now Open!

Caltrans has now completed its repair work at the Stewart Drive & Tiburon Boulevard intersection and the crosswalk has reopened.

As a reminder, the crosswalk at Stewart Drive is an enhanced crosswalk using a HAWK (High-Intensity Activated CrossWalk) signal. HAWK signals are designed to help pedestrians cross busy streets more safely than traditional crosswalks.

Caltrans intends to install another HAWK signal at Tiburon Boulevard & Ned's Way later this year.



How to Use a HAWK Signal

For pedestrians, HAWK signals operate like any other traditional crosswalk. When you are ready to cross, press the button, and WAIT for the signal on the opposite side of the street to direct you to cross. It may take up to a minute for the signal to change.

For motorists, the signal appears differently than other crosswalk lights. Once the signal is triggered by the pedestrian, the HAWK will go through a series of red and yellow sequences requiring motorists to slow down before signaling a solid red STOP light. It may take up to a minute for the HAWK to signal motorists to STOP.

Once triggered, the HAWK will:

- **Flash Yellow** – Proceed cautiously and slow down; a pedestrian has triggered the beacon
- **Solid Yellow** – Prepare to stop
- **Solid Red** – STOP
- **Flashing Red** – STOP – then motorists may proceed with caution if clear

It's Official: The Town Has Bought the RBSD Ponds Adjacent to McKegney Green

As of late last week, the Town of Tiburon is the proud new owner of a portion of land in the Richardson Bay Lineal Park that was previously closed off for public access and enjoyment.

The Town has purchased the land adjacent to the Richardson Bay Sanitation District, currently occupied by several water treatment ponds that have not been used by the District for some time. In the coming months, the Town will complete the State-mandated closure process, which includes draining the ponds and regrading the area to prepare it for a future use.

Caltrans: US-101 Ramp Night Work This Week

Caltrans will continue its bridge preservation project this week with nightwork and lane closures on the US-101 ramps on and off Tiburon Boulevard.

There will be lane closures in place at night this week through the morning of Friday 4/25 from 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. The Northbound US-101 off-ramp bus stop at Tiburon Boulevard will also be closed during this time.

Detours will be marked, and CHP will be on site during the closures. Please use caution when moving through the construction area.
