Interactive Traffic Study Workshop Tomorrow

Join the conversation December 3 at 6 p.m. at Town Hall



Earlier this year, the Town Council initiated a detailed transportation and infrastructure study for Tiburon Boulevard (SR 131) to develop a comprehensive plan to address traffic challenges and improve the overall transportation network.

The study focuses on Tiburon Boulevard (from Blackfield Drive to Beach Road), Trestle Glen Boulevard, and sections of Paradise Drive, aiming to reduce delays, ease congestion, and enhance safety. [View the presentation from Parametrix here.](#)

We invite you to join a community workshop on December 3, 2024, from 6:00–8:00 p.m. at Town Hall. The workshop will feature interactive stations covering the study area, congestion and delays, safety, trip characteristics, and input from Caltrans.

Overnight Work on Lyford Drive Requires Road Closure

Pacific Gas & Electric will be conducting work on Lyford Drive overnight tomorrow night, Tuesday, December 3. **The portion of Lyford Drive north of Acela Drive will be closed between 10 p.m. Tuesday night and 6 a.m. Wednesday morning.** Emergency vehicles will retain access to the closure area.

Access will be limited during the closure period to:

- Bartel Court
- Heathcliff Drive
- High Meadow Lane
- Lyford Drive (north of Acela)
- Meadow Hill Drive
- Place Moulin
- St. Gabriele Court
- Sugarloaf Drive
- Venado Drive

Upcoming Holiday Closure: What it means for your project

Tiburon Town Hall will be closed for the winter holidays beginning Tuesday, December 24, 2024 and will resume regular working hours on Monday, January 6, 2025.

During the closure, the Building Official will allow architects to inspect architectural building features and engineers to inspect engineered building features. This option will expire on January 2, 2025,



and is permitted for all construction, excluding foundations, which need to be verified by the Building Division for property line setback requirements.

A daily report must be compiled for each inspection by the design professional with their name, signature, a complete description of the work, and the location of the work accepted. Please submit all reports by the design professional no later than January 6, 2025. Please be advised that additional inspections may be required as deemed necessary by the Building Official.

Congratulations to our Chipper Day Champions!

Meet Tiburon's 2024 "Chipper Day Champions" – the Eesley family! This hardworking crew cleared an impressive 36 truckloads of vegetation clippings and debris, totaling about 76 cubic yards! The family showed up to all five Chipper Day events with their truck packed to the brim with yard clippings -- averaging seven trips each weekend. The whole family pitched



in on clearing their defensible space, turning wildfire prevention into a true family affair.

Chipper Day, held on second Saturdays from May to September and hosted by Tiburon Fire, Town of Tiburon, and Mill Valley Refuse, makes it easy for residents to clear out yard waste and boost wildfire safety. This year, residents dropped off some 2,440 cubic yards of waste, equating more than 223 tons!
