Earlier this year, the Town Council initiated a detailed transportation and infrastructure study for Tiburon Boulevard (SR 131) to develop a comprehensive plan to address

traffic challenges and improve the overall transportation network.

The study focuses on Tiburon Boulevard (from Blackfield Drive to Beach Road), Trestle Glen Boulevard, and sections of Paradise Drive, aiming to reduce delays, ease congestion, and enhance safety. [Learn more.](#)

Downtown Housing Development Application Received



The Town of Tiburon has received a preliminary application from Russell Square Consulting for the development of 120 housing units across 4 parcels located in downtown Tiburon. The parcels and proposed development densities are listed below:

1525 Tiburon Boulevard (the parking lot next to Town Hall): 26 units

1600 Tiburon Boulevard (the site of the former Shark's Deli): 12 units

1601 Tiburon Boulevard & 4 Beach Road (the site of the former Bank of America and adjacent parking lot): 82 units

Overall, the proposal includes 112 market-rate units and 8 very low-income units, including 163 parking spaces. [More information and the preliminary application is available for review here.](#)
