Traffic Advisory: Caltrans to Begin Utility Potholing on SR-131 Work begins evening of June 2, Traffic control will be in place



TRAFFIC IMPACT NOTICE



Caltrans is scheduled to begin utility potholing on both directions of the full length of Tiburon Blvd. also known as State Route 131 (SR-131) in Marin County from the U.S. 101 exit to Main Street (approximately four miles).

Work will be performed at night, between 8:00 PM and 6:00 AM, Monday through Friday.

Workers will perform potholing on SR-131 to safely locate underground utilities in preparation for the upcoming paving project of SR-131 scheduled in 2026.

Eastbound and westbound lanes of SR-131 will be subject to one-way traffic control. Only one lane will be open at a time, with traffic alternating directions through the work zone.

All work depends on weather. **Normal project work hours are 8:00 PM to 6:00 AM Monday through Friday.** Work will be completed tentatively by July 2025. Town Council Adopts Class 2 e-Bike Ordinance Riders must be 16+ and wear a helmet



On Wednesday, May 21, the Tiburon Town Council adopted an ordinance limiting the age of Class 2 e-bike riders to 16 and older and requiring all Class 2 or Class 3 e-bike riders to wear a helmet. Class-2 e-bikes are operated with a throttle and do not have pedal assist. Class 1 e-bikes, which are pedal-assisted and do not have a throttle, would remain operable for youth under 16.

This ordinance will take effect on July 1, 2025.

Summer Paving Project: Paradise Drive Paradise Drive from Mar West to Agreste Way to be paved in June




Later this month, the Town of Tiburon will begin the Paradise Drive Pavement Rehabilitation Project, which will improve the roadway between the intersections of Paradise Drive/Mar West and Paradise Drive/Agreste Way. The work involves reconstructing the existing pavement and is expected to take about 45 working days.

Lane closures and temporary delays are anticipated, but traffic control personnel will be onsite daily to help guide vehicles through the area. Residents will receive door hanger notices with specific dates and details before construction begins.

Town staff will also be onsite throughout the project to oversee progress and address any concerns. We appreciate your patience as we complete this much-needed roadwork.

Storm Drain Improvements Coming to Karen Way, Claire Way, and Bel Aire Play Area



Starting in June 2025, the Town of Tiburon will begin a storm drain rehabilitation project to improve drainage on portions of Karen Way, Claire Way, and within the Bel Aire Play Area. The project also includes upgrades to street drainage in front of Bel Aire School. Work will involve trench excavation to replace aging storm drain pipes, followed by full street repaving in the affected areas. Construction is expected to last about 35 days.

Lane closures and minor delays are anticipated, but flaggers will be onsite daily to help guide traffic. Town staff will be present throughout the project to oversee the work and respond to any concerns. Residents will receive door hanger notices with more detailed information as the project approaches. Thank you in advance for your patience as we complete these

important improvements.

June is Compost & Pollinator Month!
Composting Creates Healthy Soil for Pollinator-Friendly Plants!



Did you know that composting is a secret weapon for supporting our valuable pollinators?

Healthy soil, enriched by compost, grows stronger and more vibrant plants. These robust plants produce more nectar and pollen which is the essential food sources that bees, butterflies, and other pollinators rely on!

Here's how your compost helps:

Nutrient-rich soil: Compost provides the vital nutrients plants need to thrive and produce abundant flowers.

Water retention: Compost helps the soil hold moisture, keeping pollinator-friendly plants healthy even during drier periods.

Reduced need for pesticides: Healthy plants are naturally more resistant to pests and diseases, reducing the need for harmful chemicals that can hurt pollinators.

So, keep composting those kitchen scraps and yard waste! Fruit and veggie scraps, coffee grounds, eggshells, and yard trimmings can all go directly in your green bin.
