Traffic Advisory: Paradise Drive Paving Project
Work scheduled to begin July 21 from Mar West to Agreste Way
Traffic control will be in place; prepare for delays



Next week, the Town of Tiburon will begin the Paradise Drive Pavement Rehabilitation Project, which will **improve the roadway between the intersections of Paradise Drive/Mar West and Paradise Drive/Agreste Way**. The work involves reconstructing the existing pavement and is expected to take about 45 working days.

Lane closures and temporary delays are anticipated, but traffic control personnel will be onsite daily to help guide vehicles through the area. Residents will receive door hanger notices with specific dates and details before construction begins.

Town staff will also be onsite throughout the project to oversee progress and address any concerns. We appreciate your patience as we complete this much-needed roadwork.

**E-Bike Ordinance Now in Effect: Class 2 Limited to Age 16+
Be like Skippy: have fun and be safe!**




♂ Heads up e-bikers: as of July 1, throttle-powered Class 2 e-bikes are now limited to riders over the age of 16 in Tiburon and Marin County.

Class 1 e-bikes, which are pedal-assisted and do not have a throttle, remain legal for youth under 16. Helmets are always required for all bike riders.
