

Electrify Marin: Rebates Available for Replacing Gas-Powered Appliances with Energy-Efficient Electric



Looking to make your home healthier, more energy-efficient, and better for the planet? The Electrify Marin Rebate Program can help you do just that and save money in the process.

Marin County is offering rebates to homeowners and renters who replace old, gas-powered appliances with efficient, all-electric alternatives. Upgrading to electric appliances not only reduces your carbon footprint, but can also improve indoor air quality and support California's transition to clean

energy.

Rebates are available for a wide range of upgrades, including:


- ✗ Heat pump water heaters
- ✗ Heat pump HVAC systems
- ✗ Induction cooktops and ranges
- ✗ Heat pump clothes dryers
- ✗ Electrical panel upgrades (when needed to support appliance changes)

Please note that these upgrades may require a building permit. Please contact Tiburon's Building Division at (415) 435-7380 with questions. Additional rebates are available for income-qualified households, making this program even more accessible to those who need it most.

Curating Color: Wildlife Photography by Susan B. Katz Friday, September 19 at 6:00 p.m. | Tiburon Town Hall



Join us on Friday, September 19 at 6 p.m. for the opening reception of a vibrant new photography exhibit celebrating the colors of the natural world. From the teal feathers of hummingbirds to fields of red poppies and the orange-and-black wings of migrating monarchs, these images capture those fleeting moments in nature that make us stop, smile, and look closer.

The artist—an author, traveler, and lifelong naturalist—shares photographs taken across the globe and right here at home, each one reflecting the joy, surprise, and personality of wildlife. Come enjoy an evening surrounded by color, connection, and stories from the wild.

The exhibit runs in the upper gallery at Town Hall from September 1 to October 30.

Cedars in the Town: Art Exhibition by Cedars of Marin Now through October 31 | Tiburon Town Hall

Cedars Studios presents an exhibit featuring artists Reed Feshbach and P.J. Randolph, who each bring a deeply personal approach to text-and still life based expression. Reed's fascination with numbers and letterforms began in early childhood, while P.J.'s love of language was sparked by bedtime stories and the letters he wrote to a childhood sweetheart.



Now, as young adults, both artists continue to explore the written word through their own distinct styles—whether painted by hand or shaped with digital tools. Together, their works transform language into vibrant, thought-provoking forms of communication that reflect their unique journeys.
