A Word from the Mayor



Hello Everyone:

I hope you all are doing great and getting ready for the holidays. Your Town Council has been hard at work not only protecting the public health but also protecting our environment. With local youth in Marin vaping at twice the statewide average, it is critical that we take major steps to reduce teen addiction. I am so happy to have sponsored the ordinance to ban all Tobacco sales in Tiburon, making Tiburon the first in the nation to ban tobacco sales without exemption.

With our unanimous vote, we made a choice to save lives and save the environment. By banning all tobacco sales here in Tiburon, we are preventing youth from getting addicted, and protecting public health as we protect our environment. Tobacco use remains the leading cause of preventable death in the United States, claiming more than 480,000 lives per year (CDC, 2024).

Cigarette filters, which are made of plastic, are the biggest single source of single-use plastic, finding its way into our rivers, bays, and streams. It is not often that we get to do major policy that will benefit future generations, and save the environment at the same time. I want to thank the Marin Youth Advocacy Committee, the San Francisco Marin Medical Society, Smoke Free Marin, and Action on Smoking and Health for their amazing work.

Consultants Hired for Upgrades to Former RBSD Ponds, Belveron Mini Park, Cypress Hollow Park, & Bel Aire Play Area




Tiburon is moving forward with upgrades for the former sanitation ponds site and three local mini parks. At their October 15 meeting, the Town Council authorized the Town hire RHAA Landscape Architecture and Planning for the former RBSD ponds site between Blackie's Pasture and McKegney Green and nearby Belveron Mini Park, and Carlile Macy Inc. for Cypress Hollow Park and the Bel Aire Play Area.




PG&E will be working overnight to prepare for the electrification of the Angel Island Tiburon Ferry. **Lower Main Street will be closed to vehicles from the Tiburon Boulevard intersection to just past 21 Main Street, weeknights from 10:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m.**

Sidewalks will remain open to pedestrians and detours will be in place. PG&E will advance notice customers of any planned power outages. Some construction noise is anticipated.

Upcoming Public Works Projects



Ring Mountain Fire Road Grading Project

In early November (weather permitting), a contractor working for the Town of Tiburon will perform maintenance to the Shepherd Way Fire Road within the Ring Mountain Open Space Preserve area. During the work, portions of the fire road will be closed for access by hikers as there will be heavy equipment working in the area. Work is expected to take approximately one week to complete.



San Rafael Avenue Seawall Repair Project

Starting on November 10, a contractor working for the Town of Tiburon will perform repairs to the rock lined seawall near Bramble Beach, adjacent to 6 San Rafael Avenue. During the work, an intermittent lane closure with flaggers will be in effect. The pathway in the area will also be closed to pedestrians and a detour around the work area will be in effect. Work is expected to take approximately one week to complete.

Get Ready for Storm Season

As we approach storm season, it is important to plan ahead. **Gusty winds and rain are forecasted for Wednesday, November 5.** PG&E advises residents to [keep your home safe during heavy rainfall and winds](#), [prepare for potential power outages](#) and exercise caution during and after the storm. Stay safe by [avoiding downed power lines](#), using flashlights instead of candles, and keeping a backup phone or portable charger on hand.

If you plan on installing a large capacity backup power source or permanent generator this storm season, you may require a building permit. Contact the Building Division for more information at 415-435-7380.

Get storm ready:

- 🌧️ Trim branches and vegetation at risk of falling during a storm.
- 🌧️ Clear leaves and debris from gutters and storm drains
- 🌧️ Those living in flood prone areas should be prepared for flooding impacts.
- 🌧️ Secure outdoor objects that may be picked up by wind.

It's Time to Winterize Your Construction Site

Do you know the winterization requirements?

Construction sites are subject to erosion and runoff during the rainy season and the Town requires that all necessary steps be taken to ensure that runoff does not carry soils or other site detritus into the storm drain system or onto neighboring properties.

All construction sites are required to be winterized between October 15 and May 1 of every year, including erosion and sediment control measures that are specified on project drawings. If your plans do not contain erosion and sediment control measures, review the [Tiburon Building Division's Winterization and Site Management Requirements](#).

Voting & Ballots

Marin County voters may now vote in person at any Vote Center throughout the County, and all registered voters will automatically receive a vote-by-mail ballot. [A full list of Marin's Vote Centers can be found here.](#)

Ballots were mailed by the Marin County Elections Department. Voters may drop their ballots at the post office, in a post office mailbox, or in any Ballot Dropbox throughout the County.

There is no Ballot Dropbox at the Tiburon Town Hall. Tiburon's closest Ballot Dropbox is at Belvedere City Hall (450 San Rafael Avenue) on the lower level near the Community Center. 


