Tiburon Turns 50 - Downtown Tonight!

Today is the day! Come celebrate 50 great years as a town! The extravaganza on Shoreline Park and on Main Street begins at 6:00 p.m. this evening. Both areas will be closed to traffic to accommodate a truly grand party. No fewer than four bands will entertain

during the evening: Wonder Bread 5, Overbite, and the Redwood High School Band will perform in Shoreline Park, and very special guest Carlos Reyes and Band will be performing on Main Street.

And at nightfall -- FIREWORKS! A spectacular 20-minute show will be launched into the air from a barge 1,000 feet from shore.



In addition to live music, there will be food trucks and local food and drink purveyors along Shoreline Park and on Main Street, as well as the al fresco dining on Main Street we love

<u>Tiburon</u> <u>Peninsula</u> <u>Foundation</u> from Friday Nights on Main. Inflatable jumpies for kids will be happening on Paradise Drive, and the Railroad and Ferry Museum will be open, too. It is a real delight for young and old and particularly appropriate for this anniversary as it tells the story of the Town's early history as a railroad town.

And instead of jumping into your car or otherwise heading up the peninsula after the fireworks, regroup on Main Street and swing to Grammy winner Carlos Reyes and his band with dancing in the street until midnight.

Traffic on the Boulevard is unavoidable for a big party downtown, so plan around that if you can: consider walking, biking or using transit (there's special late service until midnight). The Marin County Bicycle Coalition is providing free, secure bike parking, so you can park your wheels worry free. Plan to beat the crowd by sticking around for music, dancing and food after the fireworks. More details are available here.

Tiburon Flood Insurance Informational Meetings and FEMA's San Francisco Bay Coastal Study

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has been

conducting a San Francisco Bay Coastal Study in order to revise its flood rate maps with respect to portions of the Bay Area. This study constitutes a very detailed mapping of the portions of the Bay Area subject to coastal or bay influenced flooding (wind-enhanced tides, wave run-up, etc.) as opposed to more traditional flooding from streams.

FEMA recently released Preliminary Flood Rate Insurance Maps (FIRMs) resulting from the Coastal Study. It is anticipated that the revised maps will be made final by FEMA later this year and become effective in spring of 2015.

Flood zone boundary lines appear to have changed relatively little on the preliminary maps. However, the maps would raise the "base flood elevation" by one foot in most of the Downtown commercial area, and by anywhere from 1 to 6 feet in areas fronting the bay. Potentially affected areas include but are not limited to the entire Downtown area and bayside parcels on Greenwood Beach Road, Mar East Street (potentially all evennumbered addresses from 2100-2352), Old Landing Road (even-numbered addresses from 16-36 inclusive), Paradise Drive (potentially all even-numbered addressed between 2000 to 2380, as well as several scattered addresses in the 3600, 4200, 4400, and 5000 blocks), Ranch Road (even-numbered addresses), San Rafael Avenue, and several addresses on Seafirth Place and Seafirth Road. The base flood elevation increase could pose obstacles for persons wishing to build new homes or perform substantial remodels on dwellings in the affected areas.

The Town has mailed a notice to property owners potentially affected by the preliminary revised maps. This notice contains links to mapping data, resources, and contact persons and can be accessed at the following link:

Mr. Sung will perform Robert Schumann's Noveletten, Op. 21. (For a preview, visit his <u>website</u>.)



Artist Laureate Lecture Series: "The Landscape Painter as Historian"

The next in our series of art lectures is "The Landscape Painter as Historian" with our guest speaker, Joan Palmero.

Joan describes herself as an art enthusiast. Her goal is to introduce as many people as possible to what she calls "her friends" - that is, the artists of Latin America beyond Diego Rivera and Frida Kahlo.

Born and raised in Belvedere, and currently employed by the Town of Tiburon, Joan has spent all of her adult life connected to Latin American culture. She lived in Mexico City where her children were born, and remained tied to that country and its people following her return to the United States.

Joan served as a Spanish/English translator for several years, and was a docent at the Mexican Museum for 6 years. She now does

presentations on aspects of Latin American art that catch her eye.


Her presentation of two well-known and respected Latin American artists, Joaquin Clausell and Gerardo Murillo (examples of their paintings are seen above), is entitled "The Landscape Painter as Historian". Joan will reveal two incredibly beautiful but very different painting styles and the history they preserved.
