Letter from the Town Manager

Dear Tiburon Residents,

Mark your calendars for the weekend of April 21-23, as these are the dates for the big 20th Anniversary event planned for both the Belvedere-Tiburon Library and the Tiburon Town Hall. This 3-day event will celebrate the opening of both buildings, which completed the bold plans for a new civic complex envisioned and supported by the residents of Tiburon.



The Belvedere-Tiburon Library was completed first, opening its doors on April 13, 1997. The movement for a library for the City of Belvedere and the Town of Tiburon started ten years earlier when a group of local residents from both communities began their discussions. As the word spread, many people joined the effort, and their vision began to become a reality. The Zelinsky family donated the land, a generous and incredible gift which became the perfect location for a library. Community volunteers from both Belvedere and Tiburon raised the money, shepherded the project through the political process, and oversaw the design and construction.

A month after the library was completed, the Town of Tiburon opened its new Town Hall right next door, on land also generously donated by the Zelinsky family. This provided not only a new, state of the art home for Town offices, but also a much needed space for community events and Zelinsky Park, the beautiful, peaceful open space behind Town Hall.

The weekend will be filled with exciting events, including two evening galas, uniquely different. Friday, a Pop Up current event presentation party, and then an all-out anniversary bash on Saturday with a casino, live music, and a chance to channel the Roaring Twenties. There is a day for the kids, and Sunday will be especially important, as the volunteers past and present who brought the project of these two buildings to fruition will be honored. Current Town officials will be speaking, and you will have the opportunity to see and meet with past and present townsfolk who so kindly gave their time and passion to see this grand undertaking through to completion. We look forward to seeing you there.

Public Works Update



After the rains this winter, vegetation is growing well in Tiburon. Please remember that homeowners are responsible for keeping vegetation along the frontage of their property cut back off the roadway. All vegetation should be cut to:

- the back of the sidewalk, or
- the back of the curb where there is no sidewalk, or
- the edge of asphalt where there is no curb.

Trees should be limbed up to at least 13 feet if they hang over the roadway.

Proper vegetation maintenance ensures that street sweepers can do their jobs, roadways are open for bicyclists and pedestrians, and emergency vehicles have full road width.

Monday - Friday: 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.
Saturday: 9:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. (quiet work only)

Quiet work is defined as work that cannot be heard beyond the property lines. No work is permitted on Sundays or Town-observed holidays.

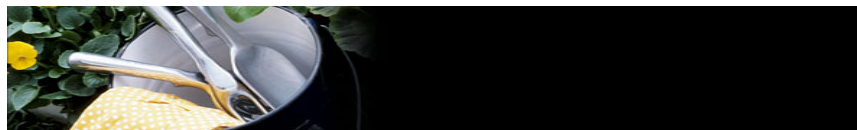
